

Dear 2nd Grade Parents,

This Year we will be using a colored "clip chart" to monitor our behavior and classroom choices. Your child will have a clip in our classroom that they will physically move up or down the chart, depending on their choices. Please keep in mind that your child may not move their clip every single day! In order to move up, students must go above and beyond in their behavior choices, and poor choices will result in moving their clip down.

The table below explains how the clip chart works.

ROCKIN' BEHAVIOR	Students who continue to make good choices reach the red level of Rockin' Behavior, will be rewarded for their positive choices, and receive a special certificate of recognition. <u>If their choices exceed "Rockin' Behavior", they will get to move their clip "off the chart" and the teacher will wear it on her shirt for the day!</u>
CAN I HAVE YOUR AUTOGRAPH?	Students who make good, positive choices move up to the orange level. They are one step closer to having Rockin' classroom behavior!
LET'S ROCK N ROLL!	Everyone starts the day on green - "Let's Rock n Roll". Students can "clip up" or "clip down" throughout the day depending on their behavior choices.
SINGING THE BLUES	Students who receive a warning will move to blue. This serves as a reminder to students to think about the choices they make.
SPEAK WITH MANAGEMENT	Students who continue to make poor choices will move to purple resulting in a consequence. A note will also be sent home about the poor choices.
ALL TOUR DATES CANCELLED	Students who continue making poor choices will move to pink. This will result in additional consequences, parent contact and the principal will be notified.

A student can move up out of the blue, purple or pink sections if their behavior is outstanding for a whole class (subject) period. So, there is constant reinforcement of and encouragement for outstanding behavior even if the student has made one or two poor choices. This is to encourage and promote positive behavior. Parents will still be contacted if students' clips have been moved to pink or purple at any point.

I believe this will be a positive way for students to monitor their choices and will give them behavior goals to strive for! Don't hesitate to ask if you have any questions! Thank you for your support!
